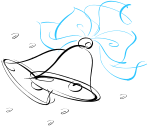

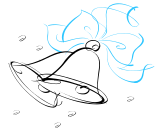

## **BATTERED BUT BEAUTIFUL**

For my birthday Julie bought me a silver ID bracelet. You know the kind of thing. It has a bar in the middle for my name, or her name, or anything else I might want inscribed on there.

Well, I know both our names, so I tried to think of something more useful. A bible verse that had swept me away a couple of times came to mind. It's after the resurrection when the disciples are out fishing; John looks up and sees a man on the shore. "It is the Lord," he says.

Tying that in with the notion of Jesus being the Word and all things being made through Him I'd come to realise that it is ALL the Lord!

Except, sometimes I forget. So having it inscribed on my bracelet would be a useful reminder. So, in a shopping mall in Pennsylvania, I handed it across the counter to a young woman who repeated the words I had written on a slip of paper. "It is the Lord," she said – with a little gentle emphasis on the last two words.

My companion asked, "Do you know the Lord?" She smiled and replied, "I do."

So, the bracelet was inscribed and I've worn it ever since.

Because it's a loose fitting thing the inscribed bar usually slips around and ends up under the heel of my hand. If I put my right palm down on a table, worktop, or any other solid surface, there's usually a little rattle or clunk. (It just happened again as I finished typing the last sentence and rested my wrist on the laptop.)

The end result of all these little bumps is that, after only a few months, the bar bearing those words has already become quite marked.

When I noticed this I felt disappointed – and sad. The bracelet is precious to me as a gift. The words were precious to me as a reminder that Jesus is in everything and can be found everywhere. And those beautiful words were battered and scarred.

Then I realised. So was He. Jesus, a gift worth more than silver or gold,

had ended up battered and scarred on the cross. That fact didn't diminish the beauty of God's gift. It enhanced it!

So, I'll keep wearing my birthday bracelet and it will probably get more marks on it. But that's what life does. It bends and breaks our bodies but it doesn't detract one bit from our value.

I'll remember that when I see others beaten down by life. And I'll remember it when I am feeling the same way. Our value isn't in the body we stand up in, the clothes we wear, the houses we live in, our value is entirely in the deep Love that is freely given to the best and the worst of us, no matter how battered and scarred we are.

And who gives that love?  
It is the Lord.

# Colleen's Visit to New Zealand June/July 2011

## *New Zealand; Christchurch*

I thought I would let you see the 2 faces of worship in New Zealand. The congregations of what were charming and vital churches are now holding worship in hotels and schools in safer areas. The city centre is totally closed to the public, is unsafe and looks like it will be demolished and a new city



centre built at some point in the future. Many people are still homeless in Christchurch. Damage extended well into the suburban areas and anomalies occur where some people's houses stand while their neighbour's has collapsed. Worryingly the expert geologists predict a similar event in Christchurch's near future. This does not bode well for the population who fear for their future and the future prosperity of a new Christchurch.

More evident damage in Christchurch city centre in these 2 pictures. There is a distinct and poignant contrast with the War Memorial, which takes the form of a bridge, the foundations of which are also damaged.



Amazingly the Central Hospital escaped damage and was able to cope with casualties. Gregor and I could see through the barriers towards the Cathedral but, as the city centre is cordoned off, alas there was no opportunity to take pictures. Our hotel was in the



“Pink” safer zone, but ceilings were propped up and large panes of glass still remained broken or cracked. We spent one worrying night in Christchurch and made good speed to the airport.

## ***NAPIER, Hawkes Bay, North Island***

A small city of contrast to Christchurch, but with a chilling connection; Napier suffered an earthquake in 1931 which destroyed the centre of the city. Over time it was rebuilt and people and businesses returned. The rebuilding itself is a stark reminder of just what mother nature can do to human endeavour, and yet human endeavour picked itself up and re-grouped.

### **Anglican Cathedral of St John, the Evangelist, Napier – North Island**

The toppling of Christchurch's cathedral was not the first such incidence in New Zealand. Napier's beloved Cathedral was destroyed by the earthquake. The town was rebuilt in the prevailing Art-Deco style of the time, but the cathedral was not replaced until completion in 1955. In celebration of the re-building it has a beautifully carved Maori Chapel and altar. As your organist I was very impressed by it's fine instrument and also glad to learn of the thriving choir and music scene.



I was pleased to take several gifts from our Mothers Union to the cathedral offices and these will be forwarded to their Association of Anglican Women (modern-speak for M U!) I also display some postcards of the cathedral interior and exterior kindly given to St Andrew's, Ardrossan. I must say that printing in colour would certainly enhance these photographs.

We should now have some interesting exchanges between our church and St John's, Napier, New Zealand. My over-all impression of Anglican churches in NZ was one of being at the heart of the community. Every church I encountered was running a café and mother and toddler group, also providing on-site caring compassion to those in need. Thrift shops were also very evident. Food for thought for our Growth Strategy?

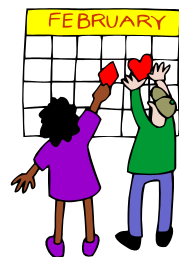
