RESTORATION NEWS

The Masons are still having a hard time (literally!) with the Cumbrian stone, but by Friday 25th Sept they had managed to get enough pieces cut to build up the tracery for the North Transept window. The glass for that window should be back in the following week, and then the masons will continue cutting stone for, and start rebuilding the South transept window. The West (Shacklady) windows are back in, without

any holes in, and the letters have been re-blacked so you can read the whole inscription. The Harrison Mann window, with the angel picking tulips, has been put in a special frame and is back in, but the glaziers got the join in the protective panes outside in the wrong place so it shows across the window, so they will re-do the outer glass when they bring back the opposite window, the women at the tomb. There is a bit of work to be done on the other plain glass windows, and some plastic repairs to window surrounds in the chancel. Most of the exterior pointing and replacement (indenting) of badly eroded stone has now been done, though the choir vestry gable end still has to be rebuilt. The problems with the stone mean that the completion date of 10 October will probably slip by a week or two, but we hope no more.
